2 VILLA TUGENDGAT

The most famous villa in Brno. Signature Functionalist monument registered as a World Heritage Site.

* The house was designed by Ludwig Mies van der Rohe for Greta and Fritz Tugendhat.

* Formal architectural purity framed in a natural setting, mutually permeating spaces, technical and structural solutions and the use of precious raw materials.

* Other important Brno villas include the Art Nouveau Löw-Beer Villa (Drobného 22), the Art Nouveau Jurkovič House (Jana Nečase 2), the Functionalist Stiasni Villa (Hroznová 14) and the newly opened Arnold Villa (Drobného 26).

3 PETROV

The Cathedral of St Peter and St Paul stands atop Petrov Hill and dominates the city's skyline. Its origins reach back to the 1170s, when a Romanesque rotunda was erected on the site.

* The Cathedral underwent one Gothic and two Baroque reconstructions; the two characteristic towers are more recent – the work of August Kirstein during a Neo-Gothic rebuild in 1909.

* At the foot of Petrov is a park, Denis Gardens, offering a panoramic view of Brno and its southern surroundings. In good weather you can see the hills of Pálava in the distance.

* The park also features a colonnade with a fountain and an 1818 obelisk to commemorate the end of the Napoleonic Wars.

4 ŠPILBERK CASTLE

A sweeping castle complex from the 13th century, rebuilt in the 17th and 18th centuries as a mighty military fortress and subsequently

as a prison for the most dangerous criminals and political enemies. Here we can see:

* Parapets with breath-taking views over Brno, and the castle, housing the Brno City Museum and also staging a variety of concerts, theatrical performances and festivals.

* Castle chimes – a 15-bell carillon; also, a lookout in the corner tower, and the Baroque Holy Trinity Chapel.

* The casemates – dark, vaulted passageways into the bowels of which have disappeared many of the Hapsburg Empire's most barbarous criminals.

5 ST. JAMES' CHURCH AND TOWER

The church and its 94-metre tower are among the nation's finest examples of Late Gothic architecture.

* Visitors can look around the entire building, starting with the freely accessible nave, from where you climb to the organ loft up a double spiral staircase.

* From here you can go to the treasury and up to the trusses, in which you will find a unique multimedia exposition. Then continue to the tower, where you will enjoy panoramic views.

6 OLD TOWN HALL

Brno's oldest secular building, centre of city government from the mid-13th century until 1935.

* The Old Town Hall has Late Gothic portal with a contorted tower, the work of sculptor Anton Pilgram.

* In its vaulted passage it shelters two symbols of Brno: a stuffed crocodile – the so-call "Brno dragon" and a wooden cart wheel.

* Old Town Hall courtyard and tower with a lookout gallery. Anton Pilgram exhibition.

7 VEGETABLE MARKET

A 13th century square with a market, fountain, sculptural group and two theatres. As in years past, here you can still buy fresh fruit and vegetables. And there's plenty to see:

* Indoor market with a view of the town.

* The Baroque fountain entitled Parnas by Johann Bernhard Fischer von Erlach.

* Dietrichstein Palace, one of the oldest palaces in Brno.

* Baroque house of the abbots of the Žďár Monastery and the House of the Lords of Fanal, where today perform the Goose on a String Theatre.

* Reduta Theatre, one of oldest theatre buildings in Europe, in which 11-year old Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart once performed.

* Labyrinth under the Vegetable Market, a convoluted network of medieval passageways and cellars.



MORAVIAN GALLERY IN BRNO

The second biggest art museum in the Czech Republic offers a broad spectrum of cultural events.

* The gallery's history dates back to 1818. Today it combines fine and applied arts in permanent and visiting exhibitions.

* MG is located in five separate and architecturally significant buildings: Pražák Palace, Museum of Applied Arts, Governor's Palace and Jurkovič House, Open Depository.

+ Other museums and galleries: Brno City Museum, Brno House of Arts, Moravian Museum, Technical Museum, Fait Gallery, Mitrovský Summer Villa, TIC Gallery, Mendel Museum, Museum of Romani Culture, Diocesan Museum and others.

NATIONAL THEATRE IN BRNO

The theatre opened 1881, following the example set by the National Theatre in Prague.

* During the season, plays, ballet and opera are performed in three buildings – at the Janáček Theatre, Mahen Theatre and Reduta Theatre. In summer, performances are held outdoors.

* Mahen Theatre – the first fully electrically lit theatre on the European mainland.

* In summer months the park in front of Janáček Theatre, with its water fountain, is thronged with people.

BRNO DAM

Popular recreation and leisure resort. The shores are lined with beaches, numerous children's playgrounds, sports facilities, and places to hire boats, paddle boats and paddleboards.

BRNO ZOO

Since 1953, Brno Zoo has been attracting visitors to its natural setting of Monk's Hill in Brno-Bystrc.

BRNO OBSERVATORY AND PLANETARIUM

Centre aiming to popularize astronomy and other sciences.

* Before entering the planetarium, you can have a go on a range of interactive exhibits, such as a kaleidoscope, pixel wall, sound tube and gravity gauge.
